I am writing on behalf of Lymm High School in support of the proposed plans for the Lymm Heritage Centre. Current changes to the KS3 and KS4 curriculum mean there is a greater demand for local history. At GCSE we now have an aspect called 'an historical environmental study', which seems ideal to link to the rich heritage of Lymm and its links with the Industrial Revolution.

The heritage centre will offer a wide range of opportunities for our students at Lymm as we have proposed to link our Scholar's Programme for gifted and talented students to complete a research project for the centre on Lymm during World War One to link into the centenary, which will then make up a temporary exhibition that will hopefully encourage the community with links to our school to visit the centre.

We would also look forward to giving our A-Level History students the opportunity to use their enrichment time to run sessions for primary school children at the centre and help with the day to day running of it so that it can be open regularly for the whole community to use. This would give them fantastic experience and enable them to develop important skills such as communication, which will help them attain university places and jobs in the future.

The centre will also provide us with artefact boxes that could be used with KS3 to help bring history to life in the classroom and enable them to understand the community that they live in.

Dear Sirs

I am writing in support Lymm Heritage Centre's application for Heritage Lottery funding.

The Heritage Centre is our nearest neighbour and we have had the opportunity to both work with it and observe its development first hand. The team, led by Alan and Su Williams, has from a standing start gained use of a semi-derelict building at a prime location in the village centre and, with the full co-operation of the owner, overseen its transformation into showpiece premises. The group has also enthused and recruited a willing team of volunteers to take the project forward.

Alan and Su Williams have a proven track record in community initiatives and, through their enthusiasm, drive and commitment, they have inspired many others in the community to sign up as new volunteers, most notably recently in the Lymm Festival of Historic Transport. Lymm is well blessed with voluntary organisations, several of which organise annual events or festivals. The Lymm Festival is a 10 day programme of poetry readings, music and other cultural events which remains popular with a rather narrow section of the community. Three years ago Alan and Su decided to launch the Lymm Festival of Historic Transport on the last day of the 2013 Lymm Festival to celebrate Lymm's historic links with road, rail and canal travel. Despite atrocious weather the day was an instant success greatly broadening the reach of the Festival to the wider community and encouraging massive participation of both residents and visitors in Lymm, while at the same time educating about Lymm's place in transport history. The drive and enthusiasm of the organisers was such that they quickly recruited dozens of new volunteers whose commitment has been such that Alan and Su have been able to take a lesser role as an independent, self-sustaining organisation is continuing to develop the event so that it is already the most popular event in Lymm attracting participation by 8000 visitors in 2016.

Su, in particular, has been a volunteer at Lymm Youth and Community Centre for many years and has worked tirelessly to educate, motivate and entertain members of the local community from age 6 years old at our Junior Youth Club to centenarians at our Senior Social.

We have watched the same process of development of an idea and enthusing and recruitment of mostly new volunteers in the launch of the Heritage Centre and have no doubt that it will become equally successful and self- sustaining. Our own experience of the interest in Lymm's rich local heritage has made us aware of the

thirst for information about Lymm's important part in the development of transport by water, rail and road as well as its link with other historical events from dinosaurs' footprints to the development of nail slitting and fustian cutting which can be only partly satisfied by the active and popular Local History Society. Visitors to our Centre frequently ask if there is somewhere where they can find out more about the heritage of the area and working with young people at the youth club we are very aware how many of them come from families form outside the area who know very little about their new home, and how popular the Water Transport school-days in conjunction with the Historic Transport Festival have become.

We have no doubts about the need for the proposed Heritage Centre and have no hesitation in supporting wholeheartedly its application for Heritage Lottery funding.
